<u>Suicide risk assessment among psychiatric inpatients: pessimism around predictive power</u>. The study authors found that the majority of models assessed lacked practical application to prevent suicide as although a high risk patient was more likely to die by suicide during admission, the majority of risk factors were so common as to be unable to differentiate in order to accurately predict the likelihood of which patients were most at risk.
