What does the social care workforce look like across the UK? The four countries have shared challenges around recruitment and retention of the workforce – challenges that are linked to poor pay and conditions, and perceptions of attractiveness of the sector. England is the only country that does not have a non-departmental public body which is responsible for the regulation and registration of its workforce. In the other UK countries, all social care workers must be on a register, and in Scotland and Wales, a qualification is necessary to work in social care.
