Talking about self-harm and suicide in primary care: the views of young people

This post summarises a qualitative paper which found that young people want GPs to initiate conversations about self-harm and suicide in primary care.

Suicide in children and young people can happen without warning

This post from reviews a records study which finds that around one third of children and young people who die by suicide have no explicit prior risk.

About 7% of UK children have attempted suicide by age of 17

About 7% of children have attempted suicide by the age of 17 and almost one in four say they have self-harmed in the past year. The figures come from analysis of the <u>millennium cohort study</u>, which follows the lives of about 19,000 young people born at the start of the millennium in England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.

'Concerning' rise in pre-teens self-injuring

Hospital admissions of nine to 12-year-olds because of self-injury across the UK are averaging 10 a week, according to data analysed by a BBC <u>File on 4</u> investigation. The rate has doubled in six years, the latest annual figures indicate.
