Combining behavioural harm reduction treatment and extended-release naltrexone for people experiencing homelessness and alcohol use disorder in the USA

Combined treatment resulted in decreased alcohol use & related harm Lancet Psychiatry

Effectiveness of psychosocial interventions for reducing parental substance misuse Systematic review showed that interventions combining parenting skills with a substance use component may show the most promise Cochrane Database of Systematic Reviews

Link between unemployment and opioid prescribing

Unemployment appears to have an impact on opioid prescribing volume in England.
