<u>Suicide prevention in England: fifth progress report</u> The fifth progress report of the Suicide Prevention Strategy for England details the steps taken to reduce deaths by suicide since January 2019.

<u>Targeted suicide prevention for LGBTIQ+ communities</u> The Black Dog Institute has released a new report with key insights for implementing suicide prevention strategies that are effective for LGBTIQ+ communities, titled Suicide prevention for LGBTIQ+ communities: Learnings from the National Suicide Prevention Trial.

Systematic Review

Implementing changes after patient suicides in mental health services: A systematic review The review, which includes 41 published papers and reports, found that the literature is focused on producing recommendations to reduce future risk of suicide in mental health services. There is a lack of focus on the extent and effectiveness of the implementation of these.

Studies

<u>PTSD-related suicides can be prevented, but we have to act fast</u> Summarises a recent Swedish cohort study of 3.1 million people, which looks at suicide risk in people with post-traumatic stress disorder.

Many men do seek help prior to suicide, but are services adequately designed to assess men's needs? This post summarises a qualitative photovoice study, which finds that some men who died by suicide did seek help before their death, but the help given was often ineffective.

Suicide trends in the early months of the COVID-19 pandemic: an interrupted timeseries analysis of preliminary data from 21 countries. This is the first study to examine suicides occurring in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic in multiple countries. In high-income and upper-middle-income countries, suicide numbers have remained largely unchanged or declined in the early months of the pandemic compared with the expected levels based on the pre-pandemic period. The authors highlight the need to remain vigilant and be poised to respond if the situation changes as the longer-term mental health and economic effects of the pandemic unfold.

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
