National Confidential Inquiry into Suicide and Safety in Mental Health – Annual Report 2020

The 2020 annual report from the National Confidential Inquiry into Suicide and Safety in Mental Health (NCISH) provides findings relating to people who died by suicide in 2008-2018 across all UK countries. Additional findings are presented on the number of people convicted of homicide, and those under mental health care.

Study

Suicide by middle-aged men

This reports on findings from a national study combining multiple sources of information that provide a detailed account from families, friends and professionals on the stresses men in their mid-life face before they take their lives.

Survey

LGBT+ pupils twice as likely to contemplate suicide

Young LGBT+ people are three times more likely to self-harm and twice as likely to contemplate suicide as their non-LGBT+ peers, according to a survey. It found that 68% of LGBT+ young people had experienced suicidal thoughts, compared with 29% of young people who were not LGBT+. Lesbian (74%) and transgender (77%) young people were the most likely to have experienced suicidal thoughts and feelings.
