Community social support and onset of dementia in older Japanese individuals: a multilevel analysis using the JAGES cohort data Among older people, a 1% increase in community-level social support (in the form of receiving emotional support) was associated with an approximately 4% reduction in the risk of developing dementia, regardless of socio-demographic variables and health conditions.
