Mutations linked to autism may be detectable in men's sperm

About 1 in 15 men carries gene-damaging mutations — some with ties to autism or congenital heart disease — only in his sperm, a small study suggests.

X chromosome exerts extra influence on brain development

The X chromosome holds stronger-than-expected genetic sway over the structure of several brain regions, a new study finds. The X-linked genes that may underlie this oversized influence have ties to autism and intellectual disability. the new findings suggest that the X chromosome, despite containing only 5 percent of the human genome, has a privileged role in shaping the brain — one that may be particularly relevant to developmental conditions. What's more, this influence may be stronger in men than in women, the study shows.

Autism mouse models cluster by brain activity pattern

Four subtypes lend new support to the idea that there isn't a single 'hallmark' type of brain connectivity in people with autism.

IQ related to muscle strength in individuals with learning disabilities

Intelligence quotient (IQ) in individuals with LD is significantly associated with muscle strength, both in the lower and upper body, according to new research.

Joanna, Jon and Ben – a Serious Case Review

Norfolk Safeguarding Adults Board published a report about Joanna, Jon and Ben, three people in their mid thirties, who died between 2018 and 2020, in a private hospital called Cawston Park. The report exposes multiple serious failures – from the physical assault of patients and failure to meet healthcare needs, to lack of record keeping and even altering records.
