## **Systematic Reviews**

Mental illness twice as common among refugees and migrants in detention, compared to those not in detention

Rates for depression, anxiety and PTSD in refugees and migrants in detention are around twice as high as rates for those not in detention, according to a new systematic review.

### Vaccines for measles, mumps, rubella, and varicella in children

Updated systematic review concludes that Existing evidence on the safety and effectiveness of MMR/MMRV vaccines support their use for mass immunisation.

### Study: What influences responses to public health messages?

New research examines what characterises effective public health messages for managing risk and preventing infectious disease and what influences people's responses to messages.

Many people with mental illness did not seek help during the first lockdown; research highlights unmet need

The number of people with mental health problems such as depression, anxiety, and self-harm increased during the UK's first lockdown. But a huge study across England found that fewer people asked their GP or hospital for mental health support.

### Mothers of children with life-limiting conditions are at risk of serious health problems

Mothers of children with life-limiting conditions have an increased risk of common health problems, including depression and heart disease.
