Randomised Controlled Trial

<u>Ketamine for the acute treatment of severe suicidal ideation: double blind, randomised placebo</u> <u>controlled trial</u>

The findings indicate that ketamine is rapid, safe in the short term, and has persistent benefits for acute care in suicidal patients. Comorbid mental disorders appear to be important moderators. An analgesic effect on mental pain might explain the anti-suicidal effects of ketamine.

Studies

Role of thwarted belongingness, perceived burdensomeness and psychological distress in the <u>association between adverse childhood experiences and suicidal ideation in college students</u>
Findings suggest that adverse childhood experiences have a detrimental impact on college students' mental health.

<u>Changes in mental health problems and suicidal behaviour in students and their associations with COVID-19-related restrictions in Norway: a national repeated cross-sectional analysis</u>

This study demonstrates a sharp increase and disturbing levels of mental health problems and suicide risk among students during the COVID-19 pandemic. Although causal conclusions cannot be drawn, the associations between closure of campuses and mental problems emphasise the importance of having access to campuses for student well-being.

Legislation

Online safety law to be strengthened to stamp out illegal content

Online Safety Bill strengthened with new list of criminal content for tech firms to remove as a priority. List includes online drug and weapons dealing, people smuggling, revenge porn, fraud, promoting suicide and inciting or controlling prostitution for gain.

Record levels of self-harm found at Derbyshire women's prison
