Systematic Reviews

Experiences of crisis care among service users with complex emotional needs or a diagnosis of 'personality disorder', and other stakeholders: systematic review and meta-synthesis of the qualitative literature

The findings suggest that emergency departments have major limitations as settings to provide crisis care for people with complex emotional needs, but there is a lack of research exploring alternatives. The quality of the therapeutic relationship was central to how care was experienced, with collaborative and optimistic staff highly valued. Staff reported feeling poorly supported in responding to the needs of this population. Research looking at experiences of a range of care options and how to improve these is needed.

<u>National suicide management guidelines recommending family-based prevention, intervention</u> and postvention and their association with suicide mortality rates: systematic review

Countries should work towards a comprehensive national suicide guideline that includes all categories of family-based recommendations. Countries with previously established guidelines should work towards the inclusion of evidence-based recommendations that have clear implementation plans to potentially help lower suicide rates.

<u>The relationship between the therapeutic alliance in psychotherapy and suicidal experiences: A systematic review</u>

The results highlight that it remains unclear how much impact suicidal experiences prior to and during psychotherapy may have upon the formation and maintenance of the therapeutic alliance. However, there is stronger evidence to suggest the therapeutic alliance during psychotherapy may be related to a reduction in future suicidal experiences. The present review highlighted several gaps and inconsistencies in the literature and made several recommendations for clinical practice and future research.
