## Study

#### Key outcomes of Long COVID identified in international consensus study

An international group of researchers and experts by experience have identified 12 core symptoms of Long COVID to be measured in research and clinical practice using a technique known as 'Delphi consensus'.

## **Cochrane Clinical Answers**

What is the accuracy of World Health Organization (WHO)-specified and related COVID-19 symptoms for the diagnosis of COVID-19?

Reviewers identified 96 individual or combination signs and symptoms for diagnosing COVID-19 in people primarily presenting in outpatient settings evaluated in cross-sectional studies.

What evidence is available on unintended health and societal consequences of measures implemented in the school setting to contain the COVID-19 pandemic?

Reviewers performed a rapid scoping review to identify and describe the evidence available on unintended health and societal consequences of measures implemented in the school setting to contain the COVID-19 pandemic.

More healthcare professionals given powers to certify fit notes
