Number of autistic people in mental health hospitals: latest data

The latest monthly Assuring Transformation NHS Digital data shows that in June 2022:

- In total 2,005 autistic people and people with learning disabilities are in inpatient mental health hospitals in England
- 1,215 (60%) of these people are autistic
- Around 190 of these are autistic people under 18.

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Independent Review

Welsh Government publishes review of autism services

Welsh Government has published the findings of an <u>independent review</u> into long diagnosis waiting times for autistic children, young people and adults. Led by Duncan Holtom, the study found that the demand for assessments and support is far outstripping the capacity of services in Wales. Over the past two years, for roughly every two children or adults referred for a diagnostic assessment, only one assessment was undertaken.

Film highlights low uptake on annual health checks

The Sunnybank Trust and Surrey Heartlands ICS Research Team have produced a new video highlighting the challenges people with learning disabilities face when accessing primary care. The <u>film aims to empower healthcare professionals</u> to take positive action and features the voices and real-life experiences of those with a learning disability.

<u>Disabled people report being blocked from NHS care due to poor communications</u>

Findings show that one in four respondents (28%) – including deaf, blind and with learning disabilities – said they had been refused help when requesting support to understand information about their healthcare. This included information being provided in formats such as Braille, British Sign Language and easy read.
