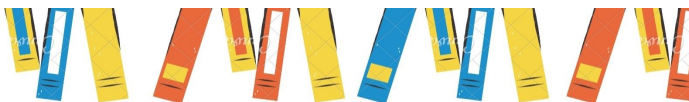

## BMJ'S COMORBIDITY TOOL

BMJ Best Practice have added a new tool to their resource. The Comorbidities tool has been developed to treat the whole patient.

The BMJ Best Practice Comorbidities tool is the only point of care tool that supports the management of the whole patient.

- Healthcare professionals are prompted to consider the patient's comorbidities when accessing treatment information.
- The tool then produces an initial management plan that is tailored to the unique needs of the patient.
- Provides guidance on the treatment of acute conditions alongside pre-existing comorbidities

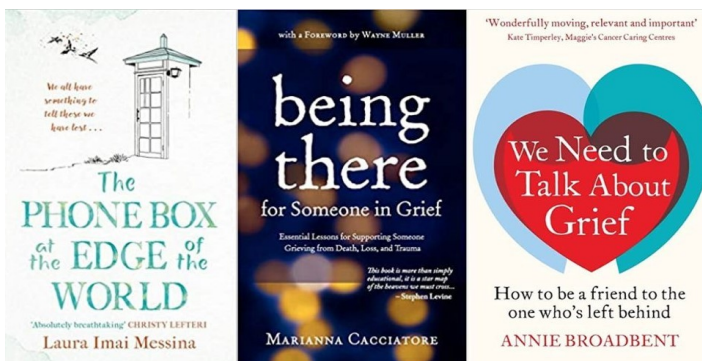
