HRT 'potentially important' in reducing women's dementia risk

Hormone replacement therapy may help prevent Alzheimer's disease in millions of women at risk of developing the condition, research suggests. A team of researchers from the University of East Anglia (UEA) and the University of Edinburgh have found evidence of the "potential importance" of hormone replacement therapy (HRT) in reducing the risk of Alzheimer's disease in women carrying the APOE4 gene. The study was published in the <u>Alzheimer's Research & Therapy journal</u>.

Gene expression dampened in synapses to protect against cognitive decline

A new study, led by Prof Tara Spires-Jones and Dr Declan King (UK DRI at Edinburgh), has identified molecular changes in the brain associated with maintaining healthy cognitive abilities in old age. The study, <u>published in the journal Alzheimer's & Dementia</u>, could provide a new therapeutic approach to improving cognition in people with Alzheimer's disease.
