<u>Public satisfaction with the NHS and social care in 2023 - Results of the British Social Attitudes survey</u> Top three findings from the BSA survey 2023

- The 2023 survey recorded the lowest levels of satisfaction since the survey began in 1983 only 24% of the public are satisfied with the NHS, and only 13% are satisfied with social care.
- Despite low levels of public satisfaction, <u>a large majority of the public still support the principles of the NHS.</u>
- 48% of the public would <u>support the government increasing taxes</u> and spending more on the NHS.

The impact of non-economic and economic disadvantage in pre-school children in England

Gaps in cognitive and socio-emotional outcomes between disadvantaged children and their peers emerge early and persist. While research has mainly focused on economic disadvantage, other factors like family dysfunction, the quality of the parent-child relationship and the home learning environment may also contribute to developmental gaps in the earliest years of life.

What is happening to young people's mental health?

Today's young people have the poorest mental health of any age group in the UK, whereas two decades ago the reverse was true. Now, one in three (34%) people aged 18–24 are reporting symptoms of 'common mental disorders' (eg anxiety and/or depression). This figure rises to 41% for young women.

What does new NHS Planning Guidance mean for mental health services?

Last Thursday, NHS England published its long-awaited 2024/25 Priorities and Operational Planning Guidance. This document is produced annually as NHS England's 'instructions' to integrated care boards about what they should prioritise in the coming year.
